SOUNDS FOR LIFE

Prepare your puppy for the noisy world around it

Noise phobias in dogs are common. Exposing your puppy to an array of sounds can help it become more confident in noisy situations later in life. Building confidence in the puppy (through short, repetitive, positive and successful sessions of noises) and creating a supportive relationship between pup and parent is important for actively socialising your puppy.

Listen to the audio on the Sounds for Life website with your puppy on a regular basis, starting at a low level and gradually increasing the volume, until it is used to the noises. Repeat until your puppy no longer reacts to the sounds.

SHOW YOUR PUPPY NEW EXPERIENCES

Early healthy interactions are key

Gradually introduce your puppy to new people, animals and things that it might come across later in life. Early socialisation and training are important to prevent bad habits and behaviours from setting in and becoming more difficult to correct.
